

SOFIA ALEXOPOULOU is a doctoral student in political science at Örebro University. She works at the interdisciplinary research school Successful ageing, which focuses on ageing phenomenon over the entire life cycle and from many different perspectives. Her doctoral thesis discusses the digital divide in Sweden and Greece. The digital divide is a wide-spread social and public problem, referring to older people's lack of access to and limited use of digital tools. The countries

selected for her study display major differences in the grey digital divide but this particular element makes them interesting to look at. The aim of the thesis is to understand how these two countries have formed their digital policies by examining closer their welfare regime. Her supervisors are Joachim Åström and Martin Karlsson.

Sofia Alexopoulou comes from Athens and was awarded her Bachelor's degree at the Kapodistrian University of Athens where she was a student at the Department of Political Sciences and Public Administration. She then pursued further studies at the same university, leading to a Master's degree in State and Public Policy. Sofia also has a Master's degree in Public Policy and Human Development from Maastricht University, Netherlands, having received a state scholarship from Greece. In addition to these degrees, Sofia is also a graduate of the National Centre for Public Administration and Local Government (EKDDA) in Greece. Currently, she works at the General Secretariat for the Coordination of the Government/Presidency of the Government, having as a main responsibility to check the implementation of the digital policies that are carried out by the Greek Ministry of Digital Governance.
